ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
OF THE

H-S LUMBER COMPANY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we the undersigned, E.B. Howe of Portland, Oregon, and Ben Sweet, now of Portl and, Oregon, but about to become a resident of Cocks, Washington, both citizens of the United States, have this day voluntarily associated for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Washington, and for that purpose we hereby make and subscribe the following articles of incorporation in triplicate.

ARTICLE I.

The name assumed by this corporation and by which it shall be known is H-S Lumber Co."

ARTICLE II.

The objects for which this corporation is formed are as follows:

1. To carry on a general lumber, logging, timber, wood and shingle business, and for the successful consumation of these enterprises to manufacture, buy and sell at wholesale and retail, logs, lumber, shingles and building material of every kind and description.

2. To purchase, own and sell timber lands, stumpage, logging roads, logging rights and privileges, and to act as agent for others in buying, handling and shipping logs, timber, stumps, wood and shingles.

3. To contract, purchase, or otherwise acquire, own and operate railroads, tram roads, logging roads, flumes, logging booms, docks and piers; and to erect, acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise buildings, sawmills, dry kilns, planing mills, shingle mills, blacksmith shops, etc., which may be necessary or convenient in connection with the carrying on of it's business.

4. To buy, sell or own all kinds of real and personal property.

5. To buy and sell merchandise.

6. To operate boarding houses or carry on any other line of business which may be necessary or expedient for furthering the interests of said corporation.

7. To purchase stock in other corporations as well as to purchase and retire or otherwise dispose of it's own capital stock.

8. To do all things except as limited by law, whether as principal or agent, in the transaction of it's said business to the same extent as a natural person could or might do, the rights, powers and privileges herein expressed being in furtherance and not in limitation of the laws of the State of Washington.

ARTICLE III. The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the same shall be divided into One Thousand Shares (1000) of the par value of One <sup>Hundred</sup> ~~XXXXXXX~~ Dollars ( \$100.00) per share.

ARTICLE IV.

The duration of the existence of this corporation shall be fifty (50) years or until the same shall be dissolved as provided by law.

ARTICLE V.

The concern of this company shall be managed, up to and including the first day of September, 1918, by two (2) trustees whose names and addresses and residences shall be as follows: E.B. Howe of Portland, Oregon and Ben Sweet of Cocks, Washington.

ARTICLE VI.

The office and principal place of business of this corporation shall be at Cocks, Skamania County, State of Washington.

STATE OF WASHINGTON to the PUBLIC.

Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern, that Albert Whitehead has appropriated, and hereby appropriates all of the water now flowing or that may hereafter flow from two certain springs located on his property in Sec. 6 T. 3 N. of R. 10 E. W. M.

By the erection of a flume or the laying of a pipe, the water from both springs to be conveyed from points located approximately as follows.

First: From a point about 400 feet South and 150 feet East of the NW Corner of the SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 6 T. 3 N. of R. 10 E. W. M.

Second: From a point about 350 feet North and 200 feet East of the SW Corner of the SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 6 T. 3 N. of R. 10 E. W. M.

The waters to converge at the last described point and are to be conveyed by pipe or flume in a south and westerly direction and are to be used by the said Albert Whitehead for irrigation and domestic purposes on his property located in Section 7 T. 3 N. of R. 10 E. of W. M. and Section 12, T. 3 N. of R. 9 E. of W. M. All of the above described property being located in the County of Skamania, State of Washington.

A copy of this notice has been posted at each of the two points where water is being appropriated and as are described herein.
