

J. A. Colfeth to George J. Sebecke

This Indenture, made the 2 day of September in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ninety nine between J. A. Colfeth (unmarried) of the County of Multnomah State of Oregon party of the first part, and George J. Sebecke of the County of Multnomah State of Oregon party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar, lawful money of the United States of America, to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quit-claim unto George J. Sebecke said party of the second part, and to his heirs, successors and assigns, an undivided half of all that certain quartz mining claim, located, surveyed, recorded and held by said party of the first part, situated in Copper Creek Mining District Skamania County, State of Washington and better known and described as follows...

The Greenhorn Mining Claim or lode described in the location notice of the same as being fifteen hundred linear feet on each side of the center of said lode, particularly described as follows: Beginning at the discovery and notice on Copper Creek in said Skamania County running thence fifteen hundred feet in a southeasterly direction to the old center end Stake of the former Ida Martin Claim; thence 300 feet in an easterly direction to the South East Corner stake, thence 1500 feet in a northerly direction to the North East Corner stake; thence 300 feet westerly to discovery and notice; thence (300) three hundred feet westerly to the Northern corner stake, and the North West corner of the Genevieve Claim; thence fifteen hundred feet southerly to the Southwest corner of the old Ida Martin Claim; thence three hundred feet easterly to the South Center end stake: This claim adjoins the Yellowbird and Big Elephant claims at Copper Creek. The westerly side line of this claim joins the northerly end line of the Genevieve Claim.

Together with all dips, spurs and angles, and also all the metals, ores, gold and silver-bearing quartz, rock and earth therein, and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, append and appurtenant, or therewith usually had and enjoyed; and also, all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, or in anywise appertaining; and the
