Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern, that the Forest Service U.S. Department of Agriculture has appropriated and hereby appropriates all the water now flowing or that may hereafter flow to the extent of three (3) cubic feet per second of time in Martha Creek Skamania County State of Washington to be used for irrigation and domestic purposes. The water to be diverted from the point or place at which this notice is posted, which is in Section 33 Township 4 North Range 7 East W.M. by the erection of a dam, and to be conveyed therefrom by a flume or ditch in a Northeasterly direction and to be used at the Hemlock Ranger Station and Nursery, which is located in Section 27 and 34, Township 4 North Range 7 East W.N.

Notice is hereby given that Rosa Walther claims the water of all the spring lying being and flowing on the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 24 T 3 N. R. 9 E. of W.M. at the point where this notice is posted, being the place of storage & diversion of one cubic foot per second of time. The purpose of this claim and appropriation of the water is for irrigation and domestic use on any part of her property in Sec. 24 or 25 T 3 N. R. 9 E. of W.M. The water now is conducted in a barrel or reservoir by means of troughs & from the reservoir a 2 inch galvanized pipe which is to be reduced to one inch pipe will be the conduct by gravity to the point desired for use of irrigation or domestic purpose.
