

Deed of Mining Claims Carl Ludloff and Others to Samson.
Pacific Copper and Gold Mining Company

For and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and for other good and valuable consideration to us in hand paid by Samson, Pacific Copper & Gold Mining Company a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Washington having its principal place of business at Chehalis Lewis County State of Washington, the receipt of which consideration is hereby acknowledged, we Carl Ludloff and Mary Ludloff, his wife, Arndt Wold and Antonie Wold, his wife, and Nils Olson and John Wold, have bargained, sold, transferred, assigned and conveyed and by these presents do bargain, sell, transfer, assign and convey to said Samson, Pacific Copper & Gold Mining Company all those certain mining discoveries, claims and interests now owned and controlled by the above named grantors or any of them or either of them, in the counties of Lewis, Skamania and Cowlitz in the State of Washington, which mining discoveries, claims and interests are particularly described as follows:

1. The Samson Lode Tunnel claim situated in St. Helens Mining district, so called supposed to be in said Lewis County discovered and located May 3rd, 1895, by Mrs Mary Ludloff, Mrs Antonie Wold and W.W. O'Connor and described and bounded as follows: - Beginning at the tunnel face in the lower part of Samson gulch (swamp by snow slide), about one mile north to North west from a Beaver Swamp on the North side of North fork of Toltle or Green river near its head waters, on the South slope of Goat Mountain and about six miles west of where the Cispus trail crosses the same mountain in St. Helens mining district, and running thence (without variation) South 35° West 750 feet to a post; thence North 55° West 3000 feet to a post; thence North 35° East 750 feet to a post on the center of the tunnel line; thence North 55° East 750 feet to a post; thence South 55° East 3000 feet to a post; and thence South 35° West 750 feet to the point of beginning; the center line of said tunnel bearing North 55° West from the face thereof for 3000 feet to a post, which center line of said tunnel is marked on the ground by stakes at intervals of about two hundred (200) feet from the face of tunnel a dead leaning tree bears North 68° East 200 feet distant; a dead snag twisted wood
