5- Samson North Extension Claim, located and discovered June 10 1895 by Nils Olson, and described and bounded as follows:-

Beginning at point of discovery of this claim in the Samson gulch (emptied by snow slide) which point is situated North 55° West and 1500 feet distant from the entrance of the Samson tunnel claim hereinbefore described; and running thence (without variation) North 35° East 300 feet; thence North 55° West 1500 feet; thence South 35° West 300 feet to the center of the lode; thence South 35° West 300 feet; thence South 55° East 1500 feet and thence North 35° East 300 feet to the point of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and registered in said Auditor's office June 18, 1895. in Volume 4 of mining records, on page 29.

6- North East Discovery Claim of the Sylvia Lode, discovered and located June 22 1895 by Karl Lindloff and described and bounded as follows:- Beginning at point of discovery at a post on a serpentine ridge before the entrance of the Samson tunnel hereinbefore described; and running thence 300 feet North 20° West; thence 1500 feet North 70° East; thence 600 feet South 20° East; thence 1500 feet South 70° West and thence 300 feet North 20° West to the place of beginning. This claim was filed and registered in said Auditor's office July 3rd, 1895 in volume 4 of mining records at page 47.

7- The South West Discovery Claim of the Sylvia Lode, discovered and located June 22 1895 by W. Wold and described and bounded as follows:- Beginning at point of discovery at a post on a serpentine ridge before the entrance to Samson tunnel hereinbefore described; and running thence 300 feet North 20° West; thence 1500 feet South 70° West; thence 600 feet South 20° East; thence 1500 feet North 70° East; thence 300 feet North 20° West to the place of beginning. Notice of location of this claim was filed and registered in said Auditor's Office July 3, 1895 in Vol. 4 of mining records at page 47.

8- West Discovery Claim of the Gladys Lode, discovered and located May 13 1895 by A. Wold and described and bounded as follows:- Beginning at point of discovery in the bed of Divide Creek below a cascade of about 15 feet north of a Beaver marsh in Samson Basin in the upper North Fork valley about 1500 feet North of camp Samson; and running thence 300 linear feet North; thence 1500 linear feet West-
