POWER OF ATTORNEY

ROBERT GEORGE O'CONNOR, et ux to BERTHA V. O'CONNOR

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, THAT Robert George O'Connor and Ethel Marie O'Connor, husband and wife, as joint tenants, have made, constituted and appointed and by these presents do hereby make, constitute and appoint Bertha V. O'Connor, their true and lawful Attorney for them in their names, places and steads and for their use and benefit to ask, demand, sue for, recover, collect and receive all such sums of money, debts, dues accounts, legacies, bequests, interests, dividends, annuities and demands whatsoever as are now or shall hereafter become due, owing, payable or belonging to them; and have, use and take all lawful ways and means in her name or otherwise, for the recovery thereof, by legal process, and to compromise and agree for the same, and grant acquittances or other sufficient discharges for the same, for them and in her name to make, seal and deliver; to bargain, contract, agree for, purchase, receive and take lands, tenements, hereditaments, and accept the selling and possession of all lands, and all deeds, and other assurances in the law therefor; and to lease, let, demise, bargain, sell, remise, release, convey, mortgage and hypothecate lands, tenements and hereditaments, upon such terms and conditions, and under such covenants as she shall think fit. Also to bargain and agree for, buy, sell, mortgage, hypothecate, and in any and every way and manner deal in and with goods, wares, and merchandise, choses in action, and other property in possession or in action; and to make, do and transact all and every kind of business of what nature and kind soever; and, also for them and in her name and as her act and deed to sign, seal, execute, deliver and acknowledge such deeds, covenants, indentures, agreements, mortgages, hypothecations, bottomries, charter parties, bills of lading bills, bonds, notes, receipts, evidences of debts; releases and satisfaction of mortgage, judgment and other debts, and such other instruments in writing, of whatever kind or nature, as may be necessary or proper in the premises.

Giving and Granting unto our said Attorney full power and authority to do and perform all and every act and thing whatsoever requisite and necessary to be done in and about the premises, as fully to all intents and purposes as we might or could do if personally present hereby ratifying and confirming all that our said Attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue of these presents.
