This Indenture Witnesseth, That I, Clarence H. Brownell, (a widower) of Underwood Stannan Co. Washington, party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred (\$400.) Dollars, to me in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents do bargain, sell and convey unto A. S. Blowers, of Hood River, Wasco County Oregon, party of the second part, the following described premises, to wit:

All of the North-west quarter (N.W. 1/4) of the North-west quarter (N.W. 1/4) of Section Twenty three (23) and the West half (W. 1/2) of Section Fourteen (14) in Township Three (3) North of Range Ten (10) East of Willamette Meridian, according to the U. S. Government Survey thereof, save and except a certain grant heretofore made to the White Salmon Boom and Improvement Co., for right of way purpose, conveying thereby a strip of land 100 feet wide on each side of White Salmon River the same being a part of the above named tract, the land first above described containing one hundred (100) acres, more or less.
