Honorable Discharge from the United States Navy

This is to certify that Stephen A. True, 1047501, a man 1 c as a "Testimonial of Fidelity and Obedience," is honorably discharged from the U. S. C. Receiving Ship at Puget Sound and from the Naval Service of the United States, this 27th day of Sept., 1919 at Navy Yard Puget Sound.

Per, according to the provisions of Section 1573 (as amended by Act of Congress approved August 22, 1912) of the Revised Statutes, if within four months from this date the said S. A. True shall present this, his, Honorable Discharge, at any United States Naval Rendezvous, and is found physically qualified, and shall re-enlist for four years, then he shall be entitled to pay during the said four years equal to that to which he would have been entitled had he been employed in regular service.

Upon re-enlistment, and the owner of this discharge, should so desire, he will receive a certificate attesting to his having been honorably discharged.
