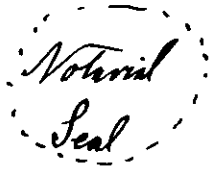

This Indenture Witnesseth, That we, Gilbert, J. Knutson and Lucile, G. Knutson, husband and wife, of White Salmon, Washington, parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred (\$500.) Dollars, to us in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents, do bargain, sell and convey unto C. F. Waldo, of White Salmon, Clackitum Co. Washington, party of the second part, the following described premises to-wit:

All of the West-half of the Southwest quarter ^{and} of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter, and the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section four (4) in Township three (3) North of Range ten (10) East of Willamette Meridian, in Skamania County, Wash. containing 160 acres, more or less according to the U. S. Government survey, thereof.

It is hereby expressly understood that said mortgages shall not sell, contract to sell or remove any part of the timber now on said premises, without first obtaining consent in writing of said mortgagee. Together with tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining. To have and to hold the same, with the appurtenances, unto the said C. F. Waldo, his heirs and assigns forever.

This conveyance is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Five hundred (\$500.) Dollars, in accordance with the terms of one certain instrument of writing, of which the following promissory note is substantially a copy, to-wit: -
