

George H. Thomas wife do Henry W. Coe.

Know all Men by these Presents, That George H. Thomas and L. E. Thomas his wife in consideration of one Dollars, to them paid by Henry W. Coe do hereby remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said Henry W. Coe and unto his heirs and assigns all their right, title and interest in and to the following described mining claim, situate in St. Helens Mining District County of Skamania State of Washington, to wit:

An undivided one sixteenth ( $\frac{1}{16}$ ) of the mining claim known as North West Chicago Extension Claim Number One, St. Helens Mining District aforesaid. Said claim being further described as follows. Fifteen hundred feet linear on to Chicago Lode beginning at the terminus of the Chicago Discovery Claim and running fifteen hundred feet (1500) linear in a North Westerly direction and three hundred feet (300) on each side of the centre of the vein. This claim is situated fifteen hundred feet (1500) Northwesterly of and adjoining the Original Discovery Claim near the head of the North Fork River.

The aforesaid one sixteenth ( $\frac{1}{16}$ ) interest having been transferred to said party of the first part by said claim by F. M. Broadbent on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Sept 1899 and the same was duly recorded by the C. Auditor of the County of Skamania State of Washington on record book F on page 459. of said County.

Together with all the dips, spurs and angles, and also all the metals, ores, gold copper and silver-bearing quartz, rock and earth therein; and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, appendant and appurtenant, or therewith usually had and enjoyed; and also, all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest property, possession, claim and demand whatsoever, as well in law as in equity, of the said party of the first part, of, in or to the said premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances.
