U. S. Army to Ellis E. Mellinger

Certificate in Lieu of Lost or Destroyed Discharge Certificate.

To all whom it may Concern:

Know ye, That Ellis E. Mellinger, a private #3,644,588 of Company K Seventy-fifth Regiment of Infantry United States Army, who was enlisted on the twenty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen to serve for period of the emergency was discharged from the service of the United States on the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen by reason of telegram A. G. O. Jan. 6, 1919. Character excellent.

This certificate is given under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902, "To authorize the Secretary of War to furnish certificates in lieu of lost or destroyed discharges," to honorably discharged officers or enlisted men or their widows upon evidence that the original discharge certificate has been lost or destroyed, and upon the condition imposed by said Act that this certificate "shall not be accepted as a voucher for the payment of any claim against the United States for pay, bounty, or other allowances, or as evidence in any other case."

Given at the War Department, Washington, D. C., this twenty-second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

Be it remembered that at a term of the District Court holden in and for said County in the Court House therein on the 21st day of January, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Seventy-four, ^{was} present the Honorable Milo M. Glathevy, Presiding Judge, W.A. Benton Sheriff of said County, and Marvin Cook, Clerk of said Court, when the following among other proceedings were had;

Frederick Zurcher, a native of Switzerland, and at present residing within said State, appeared in open Court and makes application to be admitted to become a citizen of the United States and it appearing to the Satisfaction of the Court that he had declared ^{on} oath before the Clerk of this Court, (a Court of record having common Law jurisdiction and using a

Seal) , two years at least before his admission, that it was, bona Fide his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever, all allegiance to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatsoever and particularly to the King of Switzerland, whom he was heretofore a subject. And said applicant having declared on oath before this Court that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and that he doth absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatsoever, and particularly to the Republic of Switzerland, which he was a subject. The Court being satisfied that said applicant has resided within the United States for the term of five years next preceding his admission, without being at any time during the said five years out of the territory of the United States, and within this State one year at least, and it further appearing to the Satisfaction of this Court that during that time he has behaved as a man of good moral Character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same.

Thereupon the Court admitted the said Frederick Zurcher to become a Citizen of the United States and ordered all proceedings aforesaid to be entered of record which was accordingly done by the Clerk of this Court.

In Testimony whereof I, Marvin Cook, Clerk of the Court aforesaid have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of said Court at office in said County, this 21st day of January A.D. 1874.
