Know ye, That Thomas E. Dunbar, a private of Captain Dawes Company (E) Sixteen Regiment of Wis. Inf. who was enrolled on the twentieth day of Sept., one thousand and eighth hundred and sixty-one to serve three years, is hereby discharged from the service of the United States, this eighteenth day of October, 1862, at Keokuk Iowa by reason of Surgeon's certificate of disability (Arthritic Aheimatism disability free).

Said Thomas E. Dunbar was born in Wyoming Co., in the State of New York is twenty-five years of age, five feet seven & half inches, height, dark complexion, grey eyes, brown hair, and by occupation when enrolled, a lumberman.

CERTIFICATE IN LIEU OF LOST OR DESTROYED

DISCHARGE CERTIFICATE

To all whom it May Concern:

Know Ye, That Fred Potter, Army Serial No. 4422742 a Private of Company "G" Fifth Limited Service Regiment, United States Army, who was inducted on the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, at Cass County, North Dakota, to serve for the period of emergency was Honorably Discharged from the service of the United States on the third day of May one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, by reason of demobilization.

This Certificate is given under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902, "to authorize the Secretary of War to furnish certificates in lieu of lost or destroyed discharges" to honorably discharged officers or enlisted men or their widows, upon evidence that the original discharge certificate has been lost or destroyed, and upon the condition imposed by said Act that this certificate "shall not be accepted as a voucher for the payment of any claim against the United States for pay, bounty, or other allowances, or as evidence in any other case."
