Maud Kollock, being first duly sworn, says: I am a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, residing at Underwood, Washington, Skamania County.

I was well acquainted with Alfred Haswell and Grace Haswell, his wife, the latter of whom is the grantee in that certain deed dated August 18, 1914, and recorded on the 6th day of November, 1916, at page 35, Book "Q" of Deeds, wherein Laura M. Hamilton and Lee Hamilton, her husband, were grantors covering inter alia the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 19, Township 3 North, Range 10 East of Willamette Meridian, Skamania County, Washington. That the said Alfred Haswell and Grace Haswell were residents of Skamania County for a period of several years prior to 1914 and to my personal knowledge were residents of Skamania County during 1914. The property above mentioned was acquired either as the separate property of the said Grace Haswell or the community property of Grace Haswell and Alfred Haswell, her husband. That Alfred Haswell died at Madison, Wisconsin, about three or four years ago leaving the said Grace Haswell as his widow and sole heir at law. Grace Haswell and Alfred Haswell were wife and husband since prior to the year 1914 until the death of the said Alfred Haswell and neither of them had any children.

I am also acquainted with the property described in the above mentioned deed and know of my own knowledge that F. D. Winkley and his successor in interest, Earl J. Cummins, have held possession of the said property since the time Mr. Winkley acquired title thereto, to-wit, since the year 1919. That such possession has been uninterrupted actual possession of the property and for more than ten years the said property has been occupied and cultivated by Mr. Cummins.

I am also one of the joint owners of certain land in section 18 now owned by Earl

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J. Cummins, A. A. Ausplund, G. H. Marsh and myself and am familiar with the pipe lines from the spring located upon the said property. The reservoir for the collection of the water in this spring was originally constructed about the year 1915 and pipe lines were immediately thereafter laid to property then owned by my husband and myself. This pipe line was thereafter extended to the property now owned by Mr. Cummins above described, such extension being entirely upon property now owned by me and Mr. Cummins. This pipe line has been in continuous use by myself and Mr. Cummins for more than fifteen years under claim of right and title ^{to} the easement, such possession has been open and adverse as against all persons.

Beck~~, of Stevenson, Skamania County, Washington, its true, sufficient and lawful attorney, with full power and authority to make, execute, attach its corporate seal thereto, and deliver, for it, in its name and in its behalf, as surety at Stevenson, aforesaid, bonds, undertakings or obligations as follows:

Whereby giving its said attorney full power and authority to do everything whatsoever requisite and necessary to be done for the purpose of making, executing and delivering such obligations as fully as the officers of said New York Casualty Company could do if personally present, and hereby ratifying and confirming all that its said attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue hereof, but reserving to itself full power of substitution and revocation.
