To The Board of Commissioners Skamania County, Washington.

In the matter of the incorporation of Stevenson

Monorable Gentlemen:

We the undersigned, respectfully petition your Honorable Board for the incorporation as a municipal corporation of the fourth class as provided by laws of the State of Washington, March 27, 1890 and subsuguent legislation, of that portion of Skamania County, Washington as is hereinafter described, containing less than one square mile.

Your petitioners respectfully represent that said portion of Skamania County contains more than the required population for the incorporation of towns of the fourth class; toward about 379 people within the boundaries hereinafter described.

That your petitioners are all qualified electors of Skamania County, Stevenson precinct, State of Washington, and are residents within the boundaries hereinafter described.

Assiming, at a point on the west side of Rock Creek 490 feet north of where the line between townships numbered two and three, N.R. 7 E. W.M. crosses said creek;
