

Sarah F. Copley et al. to U. M. Lauman.

This Indenture, Made this 24th day of December 1900, between Sarah F. Copley, widow of John L. Copley, deceased, and Hovey C. Copley and Frances C. Copley, heirs at law of said John L. Copley, deceased, of Elmira, Chemung County, State of New York, parties of the first part and U. M. Lauman of Lewis County, State of Washington, party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Dollars, lawful money of the United States to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quit-claimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quit-claim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns the following named and described mines, all situated in the county of Skamania, State of Washington:

First: Commencing at discovery on a small stream which flows into the North Fork of the Toutle river near its termination, or beginning where it heads from its south side, and extends fifteen hundred (1500) linear feet in a northerly direction and three hundred (300) feet on each side of the center of said vein, and is known as the Juniata cline. Located July 24th 1894, notice of location filed and recorded in the Auditor's office of said Skamania County, Washington, in book of Miscellaneous records, page 177.

Second: Commencing at discovery on a small stream which flows into the North Fork of the Toutle river near its termination from the south side and extends fifteen hundred (1500) linear feet in a southerly direction and three hundred feet on each side of center of said vein known as the Angelus cline, located July 24th 1894, by S. U. M. Lauman, J. L. Copley, deceased, notice of which location is recorded in the Auditor's office of Skamania County, Washington, in book Miscellaneous records page 176.

Third: Beginning at discovery on a small creek flowing into the North Fork of the Toutle river near the tunnel face of the Juniata claim and about 20 rods above the Juniata cline cabin and about 30 feet from the trail, about $\frac{3}{8}$ of a mile below Shafer's pass and about 300 feet from the north-westerly end of the Juniata mine claim and extends 1200
