

Sarah F. Copley et al. to H. M. Lauman.

This Indenture, made the 24th day of December 1900, Between Sarah F. Copley, widow of John L. Copley, deceased, and Hovey C. Copley and Frances C. Copley, heirs at law of said John L. Copley, deceased, of Elmira, Chemung County, New York, parties of the first part and H. M. Lauman, of Lewis County, Washington, party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars, lawful money of the United States, to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quit-claimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise release and forever quit-claim unto the said party of of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns, the following named and described mines, all situated in the county of Skamania, state of Washington, to-wit:

First.

That certain mine known as the Octavia Quartz mining claim, beginning at discovery on the North Fork of The Toutle River about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from its beginning and at the foot of a small cascade which is part of a large cascade at the top of which is the discovery of the Esther Mary claim and about 300 feet below the Christobel mining cabin, and about one half mile below the Junata mine claim and about a quarter of a mile above the separation of the Spirit Lake and Lewis River trails, and extends 1500 feet in a northwesterly direction, (North 18° West, or thereabouts). Said claim is situated in the St. Helens Mining District, said Skamania County, Washington, and is 1500 feet in length and 300 feet wide, on each side of the center line of the vein, lode or claim, and is a relocation of the Little Octavia mine which was located July 13th, 1894, location notice of which was recorded in said book of Miscellaneous Records, Skamania County, Washington at page 178. The relocation notice of the Octavia Quartz mining claim described aforesaid is recorded in book D of Miscellaneous records, said Skamania county, page 462, and is the claim set forth and described in said location notices.
