This is to certify, that K. P. Cecil, Supervisor Columbia National Forest of Vancouver, State of Washington, has made proof to the satisfaction of the State Supervisor of Hydraulics of Washington, of a right to the use of the waters of Unnamed spring, a tributary of North Fork of Lewis River, for the purposes of domestic use of Ranger Station, campground, fire protection and sprinkling, under Appropriation Permit No. 2510 issued by the State Supervisor of Hydraulics, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Washington, and is hereby confirmed by the State Supervisor of Hydraulics of Washington and entered of record in Volume 3, at Page 1090, on the 11th day of May, 1938; that the right hereby confirmed dates from September 15, 1937; that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.1 cubic feet per second.

A description of the lands under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows:
