KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that by virtue of the authority conferred upon me as Receiver of Underwood Irrigation District and pursuant to an order of the Superior Court of the State of Washington, for Skamania County, duly entered on the 25th day of July, 1938, and now appearing of record in the above entitled court and proceeding, I, Cedric Miller, as Receiver of said Underwood Irrigation District, do hereby acknowledge that I have received and accepted from Northwestern Electric Company, a corporation, the sum of Twelve Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$1250.00), together with a full satisfaction and discharge of the claim of said Northwestern Electric Company against said Underwood Irrigation District as filed in these proceedings; and that in consideration of such payment and of the satisfaction and discharge of said claim, and in pursuance of said order of said Superior Court, as such Receiver I do now and hereby acknowledge full payment and satisfaction of the lien of the bonds of said Underwood Irrigation District against any and all lands of said Northwestern Electric Company within the boundaries of said District and described in these proceedings as follows, to-wit:

The W½ SW¼, Section 14, Tp 3 N, R. 10 E. and beginning at a point 417.2 ft N of the SE corner of Section 15, Tp 3 N, R. 10 E, thence N 904.9 ft. thence W 150 ft, thence S 904.9 ft. thence E 150 ft, to the point of beginning, located in Section 15, Tp 3 N, R. 10 E, all containing 66.68 acres.

The Auditor of Skamania County, State of Washington, is hereby authorized and directed to enter of record full payment and satisfaction of the lien of said bonds, in so far as said lien affects or binds the lands of said Northwestern Electric Company herein described:
