

Albert Westall to Dr. H. M. Lauman.

This Indenture, made this 9th day of March 1901, between Albert Westall, of Lewis County, Washington, party of the first part, and Dr. H. M. Lauman of Lewis County, Washington, party of the second part. Witnesseth:

That the party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum One Hundred Dollars lawful money of the United States to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quit-claimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quit-claim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever the following named and described mines situated in Okanania County, State of Washington, to-wit: -

The undivided seven sixteenths, ($7/16$) of the following described mine; - commencing at discovery on a small stream which flows into the north fork of the Toutle river near its beginning from the south side of said Toutle river, and extends fifteen hundred linear feet in a northerly direction and three hundred feet on each side of the center of said vein, and known as the Juniata mine, located July 24th, 1894, notice of location filed in the Auditor's office of said Okanania County, Washington, in book of Miscellaneous records, page 177. Also undivided seven sixteenths ($7/16$) of the following described mine: Commencing at discovery on a small stream which flows into the North Fork of the Toutle river near its source from the south side and extends fifteen hundred linear feet in a southerly direction and three hundred feet on each side of center of said vein, known as the Angelus mine, located July 24th 1894, by Dr. H. M. Lauman and J. E. Copley, notice of which location is recorded in Auditor's office of Okanania County, Washington in book Miscellaneous records page 176. Also the undivided seven sixteenths ($7/16$) of the following described claim: Beginning at discovery on a small creek flowing into the North fork of the Toutle river near the tunnel face of the Juniata claim, and about 20 rods above the Juniata mine cabin, and about 30 feet from the trail about $3/8$ of a mile below Chafer's pass and about 300 feet from the North westerly end of the Juniata mine claim and extends 1200 feet in a Northwesterly direction about 18° W of North, or thereabouts and about 300 feet in a southeasterly direction to the Juniata mine claim, and extends the
