

Hans Nagel, Eggert Nagel, Henry Thiessen & Geo. S. Shepherd to
Jonathan Bourne, Jr.

This Indenture, Made this 18th day of April in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and One Between Hans Nagel, Eggert Nagel, Henry Thiessen and Geo. S. Shepherd parties of the first part, and Jonathan Bourne Jr, party of the second part, Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred Dollars of the United States of America, to them in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns the following mining claims situate in Skamania County Washington: to-wit:

The "Forlorn Hope" Claim in the Bald Mountain Mining District, said county and state, located by Geo. S. Shepherd, October 15th, 1900, notice of same being recorded in Book "A" of Mineral Locations on page 255, in records of the Auditor of said county.

Also the "Sam O'Shanter" Claim in said mining district, located February 21st, 1901, by Eggert Nagel as a re-location of the "John Bull" and "Columbia" Claims. Also all our interest in and to the "Columbia" Claim in said Mining District. Also all our interest in and to the "Silver Standard" Claim in said Mining District.

Together with all the dips, spurs and angles, and also all the metals, ore, gold and silver-bearing quartz, rock and earth therein; and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, appendant and appurtenant, or therewith usually had and enjoyed; and also, all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the rents, issues and profit thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, property, possession, claim and demand whatsoever, as well in law as in equity, of the said parties of the first part, of, in or to the said premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances.

To have and to hold, all and singular, the said premises together with the appurtenances and privileges thereto incident, unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever.
