This is to certify, that United States Forest Service, Columbia National Forest of Vancouver, State of Washington, has made proof to the satisfaction of the State Supervisor of Hydraulics of Washington, of a right to the use of the waters of Moss Creek, a tributary of Little White Salmon River, for the purposes of Domestic Use, Law Sprinkling and Fire Protection under Appropriation Permit No. 3089 issued by the State Supervisor of Hydraulics, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Washington, and is hereby confirmed by the State Supervisor of Hydraulics of Washington and entered of record in Volume 3, at page 1478, on the 25th day of November, 1940, that the right hereby confirmed dates from May 24, 1940; that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.15 cubic feet per second. (0.13 Domestic supply at Willard Guard station and fire protection; and 0.02 for sprinkling.)
