John L. Harris to Clyde W. Linville, Jr.

Power of Attorney.

Know all men by these presents that I, John L. Harris, M. D. of Stevenson, Washington, do hereby appoint Clyde W. Linville, Jr. my attorney, for me and in my name and on my behalf to do and execute all or any of the following acts, deeds, and things, that is to say:
