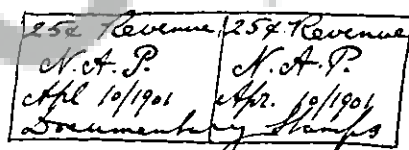


Lorenzo Hill; Byron Hill; R. A. Hill & Rudolph Surber to J. Bourne Jr.

This Indenture, Made this 9th day of April, 1901. Between Lorenzo Hill, Byron L. Hill, R. A. Hill and Rudolph Surber parties of the first part, and Jonathan Bourne Jr. party of the second part, Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred Dollars gold coin of the United States of America, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns

Those two certain quartz mining claims, situated in Township Three (3) North of Range Five (5) East of the Willamette Meridian in the Bald Mountain Mining district in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, located and known as the "John Bull" and the "Hendesen" Mining claims respectively, the said "John Bull" claim having been located June 16th. 1899 by Lorenzo Hill and recorded June 21, 1899 in Book "D" of Miscellaneous records (at page 149) of said Skamania County and the said "Hendesen" claim having been located June 21st 1899 by Byron L. Hill and recorded July 13th 1899 in Book "D" of Miscellaneous records (at page 178) of said Skamania County



Together with all the dips, spurs and angles, and also all the metals, ores, gold and silver-bearing quartz, rock and earth therein; and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, appendant and appurtenant, or therewith usually had and enjoyed; and also, all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the rents, issues and profit thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, property, possession, claim and demand whatsoever, as well in law as in equity, of the said parties of the first part, of, in or to the said premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances.

To Have and To Hold, all and singular, the said premises, together with the appurtenances and privileges thereto incident, unto the said party of the second part his heirs and as-
