5. To contract with any person for leasing for such periods, at such rents and subject to such conditions as my attorney shall see fit, all or any of my said real estate, and any such person to let into possession thereof, and to execute all such leases and contracts as shall be necessary or proper in that behalf, and to give notice to quit to any tenant or occupier thereof, and to receive and recover from all tenants and occupiers thereof or of any part thereof all rents, arrears of rent, and sums of money which now are or shall hereafter become due and payable in respect thereof, and also on nonpayment thereof or of any part thereof to take all necessary or proper means and proceedings for determining the tenancy or occupation of such tenants or occupiers, and for ejecting the tenants or occupiers and recovering the possession thereof.

6. To sell, either at public or private sale, or exchange any part or parts of my real estate or personal property for such consideration and upon such terms as my attorney shall think fit, and to execute and deliver good and sufficient deeds or other instruments for the conveyance or transfer of the same, with such covenants of warranty or otherwise as my attorney shall see fit, and to give good and effectual receipts for all or any part of the purchase price or other consideration.

7. To borrow any sum or sums of money on such terms and with such security, whether real or personal property, as my attorney may think fit, and for that purpose to execute all promissory notes, bonds, mortgages, and other instruments which may be necessary or proper.

8. In general to do all other acts, deeds, matters, and things whatsoever in or about my estate, property, and affairs or to concur with persons jointly interested with myself therein in doing all acts, deeds, matters, and things herein, either particularly or generally described and fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as I could do in my own proper person if personally present.

Certificate Record No. 4, page No. 1538. State of Washington, County of Skamania. Certificate of Water Right (For rights perfected under original, enlargement or secondary permits). (In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 117, Laws of Washington, for 1917, and the regulations of the State Supervisor of Hydraulics thereunder.)

This is to certify, that School District No. 2, Skamania County of Skamania, State of

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Washington, has made proof to the satisfaction of the State Supervisor of Hydraulics of Washington, of a right to the use of the waters of Unnamed spring, a tributary of Lunoan Creek, for the purposes of domestic supply for school and grounds under appropriation permit No. 2375 issued by the State Supervisor of Hydraulics, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Washington, and is hereby confirmed by the State Supervisor of Hydraulics of Washington and entered of record in Volume 4, at page 1536, on the 24th day of February, 1941; that the right hereby confirmed dates from October 5, 1936; that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 0.1 cubic foot per second.

A description of the lands under such right to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, and the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows:
