Brannon being first duly sworn upon my oath, depose and say: I am the son of William Henry Brannon and Virginia Elder Brannon; that I was born at Equality, Illinois on February 15, 1895 and was given the name of Marshall A. Brannon; that from infancy my parents called me "Lonnie"; that the name Lonnie has been the name by which I have commonly been called and known as ever since and is the name I have always used socially and in business dealings; that I am holding my present position as Clerk of the Skamania County, Washington Selective Service Board as Lonnie Brannon.

That I enlisted in the United States Army at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri August 15th, 1917 and was honorably discharged from the service in February, 1919, as Musician 2nd class, 81st Field Artillery, and that I enlisted and was discharged under my true name, Marshall A. Brannon.

That Marshall A. Brannon and Lonnie Brannon are one and the same person; that I am a citizen of the United States and have never been convicted of a crime.

The undersigned, Max Berger, owner of the S.E. quarter of the S.W. quarter of Section
33 - 2- 6, Skamania County, Washington, grants to James B. Gillett, his heirs or grantees,
owner of the S.W. quarter of the S.W. quarter of the S.E. quarter of same section, range
and township the right of access to install and maintain a 2" water pipe about 150 feet in
length from a flowing spring to the intersection in said tract.

Should any future owner or grantee of the Berger property above described find that
the use of this amount of water impairs the efficiency of the system on that place or that
the pipes laid are in the way of future buildings or farming operations, James B. Gillett
or his assigns agrees to give up the use of the water or to change the pipe line to comply
with requirements then arising.
