And in case suit or action is instituted to collect this note, or any portion thereof we promise to pay in addition to the costs and disbursements provided by statute, such additional sum, in like Gold coin, as the Court may judge reasonable for attorneys fees to be allowed in said suit or action.

Now, if the sum of money due upon said instrument shall be paid according to agreement therein expressed, this conveyance shall be void, but in case default be made in payment of the principal or interest as above provided then the said N. C. Merges and his legal representatives may sell the premises above described, with all and every of the appurtenances, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, and out of the money arising from such sale, retain the said principal and interest, together with the costs and charges of making such sale and a reasonable sum as attorneys fee, and the surplus, if any there be, paid over to the said Albert C. Meserve & Mary B. Meserve, heirs and assigns.
