

Geo. B. Olmsted to W. A. L. Co.

This Indenture witnesseth, That George B. Olmsted and Anna Olmsted his wife, parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred fifty Dollars to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents do bargain, sell and convey unto Wind River Lumber Co. a corporation, party of the second part, the following described premises, to-wit:

The northwest quarter of the Southeast quarter except a strip one rod wide and eighty rods long on east side, & the Northeast quarter of the Southwest quarter except that part previously deeded to Wind River Lumber Co. & lot 5 except that part previously deeded to Wind River Lumber Co. & lot 6 except one fourth acre beginning at northeast corner in lot 6 thence South 38° West 150 ft thence South 41° 30' east 131 ft. thence north to place of beginning - all in Section seven, Township three north of my right each N.W. according to the U.S. Government survey thereof. Together with tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise pertaining. To have and to hold the same with the appurtenances unto the said Wind River Lumber Co. its successors and assigns forever. This conveyance is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Seven hundred fifty Dollars, in accordance with the terms of two certain instruments of writing, of which the following are copies, to-wit:

And in case suit or action is instituted to collect this note, or any portion thereof, we promise and agree to pay, in addition to the costs and disbursements provided by statute, such additional sum, in like Gold coin, as the court may adjudge reasonable, for attorney's fees to be allowed in said suit or action.
