RE-Assignment of Contract

Know all men by these presents, That on the 30th day of September, 1943, the Aberdeen Plywood Corporation assigned to The National Bank of Commerce of Seattle the following contracts, to-wit:

- A. Agreement between United States Department of Agriculture, Forestry Service, and O. F. Lewellen, dated March 16, 1943 and thereafter assigned to Aberdeen Plywood Corporation for the purchase of certain timber in Section 8, Township 7 North, Range 5, East W. M., Skamania County, Washington, and which assignment from O. F. Lewellen to the Aberdeen Plywood Corporation is dated August 27, 1943.
- B. Contract between Weyerhaeuser Timber Company, a corporation, and O. F. Lewellen wherein said O. F. Lewellen was granted the right to remove certain timber in Skamania County, Washington, including the North Half of the Northeast Quarter, the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, Section Seven, Township Seven North, Range Five, East W. M., and the Northwest Quarter of Section Ten, Township Seven North, Range Five, East W. M., and which contract was thereafter assigned by the said O. F. Lewellen to Aberdeen Plywood Corporation on August 27, 1943,

as security for the payment of one certain promissory note in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand (\$175,000.00) Dollars and,

Whereas, said note has been paid and the debt evidenced thereby has been satisfied, NOW, Therefore, the National Bank of Commerce of Seattle does hereby re-assign the said contracts to the Aberdeen Plywood Corporation and does hereby release any interest said Bank might have in said contracts.
