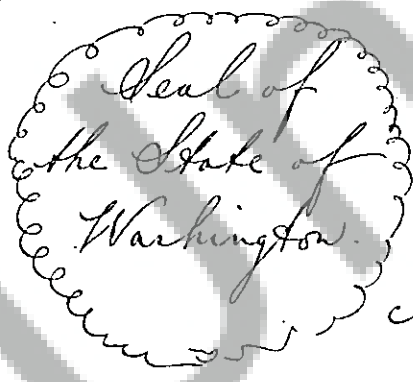
In Consideration of Seven thousand one hundred ninety-eight and 65/100 (\$7,198.65) Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the State of Washington does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Jonathan Bourne Jr., of Portland, Oregon, his heirs and assigns, the following described Grant-
ed Lands, selected and approved in full satisfaction of the grant for Public Buildings at the State Capitol under the seventeenth section of the Enabling Act. to-wit:

All of section Twenty-eight (28); the Southeast quarter and the east-half of the Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-nine (29); the East-half of the Northeast quarter of Section Thirty-one (31); the East-half and the Southwest quarter of Section Thirty-two (32), all in Township Three (3) North, Range five (5) East of the Willamette Meridian, in Skamania County, State of Washington, containing 1440.00 acres, more or less, according to the government survey thereof.

To have and to hold the said premises, with their appurtenances, unto the said Jonathan Bourne Jr., his heirs and assigns forever.
