State of Washington.

In Consideration of Six Thousand Two Hundred and Thirty and 50/100 (\$6,230.50) Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the State of Washington does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Jonathan Bourne, Jr., of Portland, Oregon, his heirs and assigns, the following described lands selected by the State of Washington for public buildings at the State Capital under Section 17 of the Enabling Act, to-wit:

The Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-two (22); the North half (N $\frac{1}{2}$) and the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-three (23); the North half (N $\frac{1}{2}$) of Section Twenty-seven (27); the West half of the Northeast quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$), and the Northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-nine (29); the West half of the Northeast quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$), and the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-one; the Northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-two (32); and the West half (W $\frac{1}{2}$) of Section Thirty-three (33), all in Township Three (3) North of Range Five (5) East of the Willamette Meridian, in Skamania County, Washington, containing 1920 acres, more or less, according to the government survey thereof.

To have and to hold the said premises, with their appurtenances, unto the said Jonathan Bourne, Jr., his heirs and assigns forever.
