

E. A. Sessions & Wife to Goat Mountain Mining & Tunnel Site Co.

This Indenture, Made this 3d day of September 1901, between E. A. Sessions and Kate D. Sessions, his wife, of Multnomah County, State of Oregon, parties of the first part, and the Goat Mountain Mining & Tunnel Site Company, a Washington Corporation, party of the second part,

Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the payment to them of \$6956 + 12/20 shares of the fully paid up stock of the said party of the second part, the receipt for which is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed and do hereby quitclaim unto the said party of the second part and to its successors and assigns forever all the following described mining property situated in the St. Helens Mining District in Skamania or Lewis County, State of Washington and known and designated as the Cliff Sode, Beginning at discovery, situated on the South slope of Goat Mountain, in Range 5 East of the Willamette Meridian, on unsurveyed land, so close to the line between said Counties that it is not known definitely in which said County said claim is situated.

The beginning of said claim is at the discovery at the creek which is the outlet of Dead Man's Lake on said mountain about 3500 feet below the outlet of said lake into said creek and about 1800 feet above North Taurle River and East of the entrance to the tunnel of the Goat Mountain Mining & Tunnel Site Co., thence in a Southeast direction fifteen hundred linear feet and three hundred feet in width on each side of the center line of the sode or vein, being the claim formerly located by W. A. Gray under the name of the Kid Sode.

Also, The Portland Sode, Northwest Extension Claim No. 1, Beginning at discovery, situated on the South slope of Goat Mountain in Range 5 East of Willamette Meridian on unsurveyed land so near the County line between said Lewis and Skamania Counties it is not known in which County the claim lies, and at a stake at discovery which is fifteen hundred linear feet in a Northwesterly direction from a small dead fir tree which stands a few feet East of the creek which is the outlet of Dead man's Lake on said mountain at a point about eleven hundred feet in a Southwesterly direction from the beginning of the outlet of said lake into said creek as near as can be estimated, which said dead fir is the common corner at discovery of the Discovery Claims Nos. 1 & 2 of the Portland Sode, and running thence from said stake at the discovery of the claim herein described in North Westerly direction
