

Thos. A. Gray & wife to Coal Mt. Min. & C. Co.

The grantor, Thos A. Gray and Sarah L. Gray of Mullock Lewis County, Washington, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred dollars in hand paid, do bargain, sell, and convey to the Coal Mountain Mining and Tunnel Site Company, a corporation the following described real estate, to wit; the following described mining locations and mining claims:-

1. The White Jacket Lode, Discovery Claim No 2, situated in the St. Helens Mining District, in Skamania or Lewis County, Washington, as follows: Beginning at discovery situated on the south slope of Coal Mountain in range 5 west of Willamette Meridian on unsurveyed land so near the line between the said counties it is not known definitely in which of the said counties the claim is located; the discovery of the claim is at a stake on the bank of the creek which is the outlet of Dead Man's Lake on said mountain about 1700 feet below the outlet of the said lake into said creek, and is the next lode staked below the Portland Lode claims on said creek; from said discovery stake the claim runs in a southeasterly direction fifteen hundred linear feet, and three hundred feet in width on each side of the center line of the lode or vein. The beginning stake on this claim is the common corner at discovery between White Jacket Lode Discovery Claims Nos 1 and 2.

2. The Hamilton Lode Discovery Claim No 2, situated in the St. Helens Mining District, Skamania or Lewis County, state of Washington, beginning at discovery situated on the south slope of Coal Mountain in range 5 East of Willamette Meridian, on unsurveyed land so near the line between said counties it is not known in which it lies; the discovery stake at discovery is near the bank of the creek which is the outlet of Dead Man's Lake on said mountain about 2300 feet below the outlet of said lake into said creek, and is the common corner on the Hamilton Lode claims No's 1 and 2 at discovery on the lead; from said stake run fifteen hundred linear feet in a southeasterly direction, and three hundred linear feet on each side of the center line of said lead, or lode. Said Hamilton Lode claims are the second series of claims south of the Portland Lode claims, and parallel with the Portland and White jacket claims.
