

in the St. Helens Mining District, Kamania or Lewis County, Washington, beginning at discovery on the south slope of Goat Mountain in Range 5 east of the Willamette Meridian, so close to the county line between said counties it is not known definitely in which ^{the} claim lies. The beginning of the claim is at a stake set at discovery on the line between Discovery claims Nos 1 and 2, of the Alexander Lode on the bank of the creek which is the outlet of Dead Man's Lake on said mountain about 2900 feet below the outlet of said lake into said creek, and running thence in a southeasterly direction fifteen hundred linear feet, with three hundred feet in width on each side of the center line of the vein or lode. This claim lies immediately below and parallels Discovery Claim No 2 and South East Extension Claim No 1 of the Hamilton Lode.

4. The Cliff Lode, Southeast Extension Claim No 1, situated in St. Helens Mining District, Kamania or Lewis County, Washington, beginning at discovery on the south slope of Goat Mountain, in Range 5 east of Willamette Meridian & near the county line between the said counties it is not known definitely in which county it is situated; the beginning of said claim is fifteen hundred feet in a southeasterly direction from discovery stake on the line between Discovery claims Nos 1 and 2, of the Cliff Lode, which last mentioned stake is at the creek which is the outlet of Dead Man's Lake on said mountain 3500 feet below the outlet of said lake into said creek and about 1800 feet above North Tottle River and east of the entrance to the tunnel of the Goat Mountain Mining and Tunnel Site Company, thence from beginning stake of this claim aforesaid in a southeasterly direction fifteen hundred linear feet and three hundred feet in width on each side of the center line of the lode or vein.
