

side of the center line of the lode or vein.

Fourth. Alexander Discovery Claim No. 1, beginning at discovery where is set a stake for the common point on the line between Discovery Claims No's 1 and 2 of the Alexander Lode, on the bank of the creek which is the outlet of Dead Man's Lake on said mountain about 2900 feet below the outlet of said lake into said creek, and running thence in a northwesterly direction fifteen hundred feet and three hundred feet on each side of the center line of the vein or lode. Said claim lies immediately south of and parallel to Discovery Claims No's 1 and 2 of the Hamilton which it parallels.

Fifth. Alexander Lode North West Extension Claim No. 1, beginning at discovery which is 1500 feet in a north westerly direction at a stake which is set a discovery of this claim from the common point on the line between Discovery claims No's 1 and 2 of this Alexander lode, at the point of discovery between said last mentioned claims which is set on the bank of the creek that is the outlet of Dead Man's Lake, and about 2900 feet below the outlet of said lake into said creek, and running thence from the beginning stake of this claim 1500 feet in a north west direction and three hundred feet in width on each side of the center line of the lode or vein. This claim lies immediately below and parallels Discovery Claim No. 1 and North West Extension Claim No. 1 of Hamilton Lode.

Sixth. The N. E. Lode No. 1, beginning at a stake on the east side of Dead Man's Creek or the stream that drains Dead Man's Lake, on the said Goat Mountain, said stake being between 4000 and 4500 feet from the outlet of Dead Man's Lake into said creek, and about 900 feet north of the Minnie Lee Mining cabin, the latter situated on the north bank of the North Fork river, and thence running northwest fifteen hundred feet and three hundred feet in width on each side of the center line of said lode.
