

J. M. Broadbent to Henry W. Coe.

Know All Men By These Presents, That I, J. M. Broadbent of Lewis County, state of Washington in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to me paid by Henry W. Coe, of Portland, Multnomah County, State of Oregon do hereby remise, release and forever Quit Claim unto the said Henry W. Coe, all my right, title and interest in and to The Chicago North West Discovery Claim, the same being in the St. Helens mining district in Okanogan County, in the state of Washington, and particularly described as follows:-

Beginning at a large larch post, having upon its side two distinct notches, said post having been made by sawing off a larch tree about twelve feet above the ground. Said post has driven into the top thereof a stake about four feet long and about four inches square. Said post is the initial point of the description of said claim and is situated about twenty-five feet southeasterly from the tunnel on said claim, and about twenty-five feet westerly from the Broadbent cabin and about one quarter of a mile northwesterly from the Lauman cabin and about one quarter of a mile northwesterly from the North Fork River, and about one mile westerly from Bismark Mountain and about eight miles northeasterly from Mount St. Helens; and proceeding from thence three hundred feet in a northeasterly direction to a hemlock tree marked with three notches, which marks the most easterly corner of said claim; thence northwesterly seven hundred and fifty feet to a center side-line stake of said claim, the same being a larch tree blazed on two sides; thence continuing on the same northwesterly course seven hundred and fifty feet to a larch tree marked with four notches and being the most northerly corner of said claim; thence three hundred feet in a southwesterly direction along the northwesterly end line of said claim to a larch tree having five notches thereon which tree marks the middle of said northwesterly end line, thence continuing on the same southwesterly course three hundred feet to a larch tree marked with six notches and being the most westerly corner of said claim; thence in a southeasterly direction seven hundred and fifty feet to a hemlock tree blazed on two sides and being the center post on
