This Indenture, made the 14<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one (1901) between J. R. Greenfield and Lillie L. Greenfield, his wife, and M. C. A. DuBuisson and Hattie J. DuBuisson his wife of Portland, Oregon, parties of the first part and Henry W. Coe of Portland, Oregon, the party of the second part, witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollars lawful money of the United States of America, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns, That certain property known as the Samson (or Sampson) Group of mining claims, in the St. Helens Mining District, State of Washington, said Mining District being located in Lewis, Stearns and Cowiche Counties in said state. Said group is situated upon a spur of the Goat Mountain Range of mountains, is crossed by the Samson Creek, is about ten miles north-easterly from Mt. St.
