to Sessions & Simpson.

This Indenture Made this 1st day of November 1901 by and between S. E. Gray of Cowlitz County State of Washington party of the first part and E. A. Sessions and C. W. Simpson, partners as Sessions and Simpson, Trustees, of the City of Portland, Oregon, parties of the second part.

Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt for which is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and forever quitclaimed unto the said parties of the second part and unto their assigns forever all the following described mining property situated in the St. Helens Mining District in Skamania County Washington and more particularly described as follows:

Columbia Lode No. 1, situated on Falls Creek about three miles below the falls thereon and on the North slope of Vernus Mountain and about one and one half miles South of the North Toutle River and about two miles Southwest of the Minnie Lee claim and the discovery is about thirty feet East of an old prospect tunnel and is adjacent to a Hemlock tree about $1\frac{1}{2}$ feet in diameter on which is written the location notice and witness also a Fir tree about 4 feet in diameter about 100 feet North of the discovery, beginning at said discovery and extending in a North-east direction therefrom 1500 feet in length and 600 feet in width, the end center lines and the corners being marked with blazed trees with the respective end center lines and corners marked thereon.

Also, Columbia Lode No. 2, situated on Falls Creek about three miles below the falls thereon and on the North slope of Vernus Mountain and about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles South of North Toutle River and about two miles Southwest of the Minnie Lee claim and the discovery is about thirty feet East of an old prospect tunnel and is adjacent to a Hemlock tree about $1\frac{1}{2}$ feet in diameter on which is written the location notice of this claim and of Columbia Lode No. 1, witness also a Fir tree about 4 feet in diameter about 100 feet North of the discovery, beginning at said discovery and extending in a Southwest direction 1500 feet in length and 600 feet in width, the end center lines and corners being marked by blazed trees, the respective end center lines and corners are marked thereon.

Also, The First Chance Lode No. 1, situated on the South side of Cfoot Mountain and North of North Toutle River and about 2000 feet North of the Black Falls thereon and about 2500 feet North west of the Polar Star mine, the discovery is in the second gulch below the Polar Star mine and is adjacent to a large dead cedar tree lying across said gulch, said tree being about 20 feet south of the discovery,
