Cox, of the County of Washington State of Oregon, party of the second part, Witness: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred Dollars, to us in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever, all the following bounded and described real property situated in the County of Shasta and State of Washington, to-wit: Lots Three (3) and four (4) and the South one-half of the North-West quarter of Section Three (3) in Township Three (3) North of Range Nine (9) East of the Willamette Meridian, containing one hundred and Sixty-two and sixty hundredths ( $162 \frac{60}{100}$ ) acres.

Together with the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining and also all the estate, right, title and interest of the said parties of the first part of, in and to the same.

To have and to hold the hereinbefore granted, bargained and described premises, with the appurtenances unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever. And the parties of the first part covenant that we are the owner in fee simple of the said premises, that they are free from all incumbrances and that we will warrant and defend them against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whomsoever.
