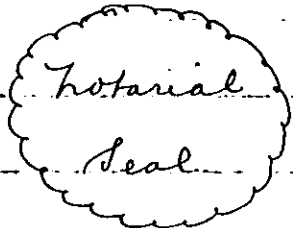

This Indenture made the Thirtieth day of Jan'y in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two between A. Hooper party of the first part and R. C. Portland the party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar of the United States of America, to me in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release, and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns: the following described mining property, to wit: Beginning at center of what is known as Ewin Creek and running from Discovery post, and running 300 feet South West to a post marked S. W. Cor. Thence 1500 ft. N. W. to a post marked N. W. Cor. Thence 600 ft. N. E. to a post marked N. E. Cor. Thence 1500 ft. S. E. to a post marked S. E. Cor. Thence 300 feet S. W. to place of Beginning. The Discovery is situated about 1/2 mile N. W. of the Eureka Claim and about one mile S. E. of Lake Meta, on Ewin Creek, a tributary to the North Lewis River and known as the "Hidden Treasury" No. 2 Mining Claim, also beginning opposite the location post and running 1500 ft. in a South East direction and 300 ft. on each side of Center of said vein. The Discovery is situated on what is known as Jumbo Creek a tributary to the North Lewis River about 600 ft. from mouth of said Creek
