This Indenture, made this 9th day of September, A.D. 1901, by and between A. Hooper, an unmarried man, party of the first part, and Cascadia Mining and Development Company, party of the second part;

Witnesseth: That, whereas, the said party of the first part on the 9th day of January, 1899, made, executed and delivered to H. A. Gray, Thomas A. Gray and James Byron a deed conveying to the said parties above named among other property, the hereinafter described mining claims, which said mining claims are described in the said deed as that is known as three Minnie Lee Mining Claims in Lewis Co. Wash.; which said deed is recorded in the Auditor's office of said Lewis County, Washington, in Volume 5 of Mining Records on page 17;

And Whereas the said H. A. Gray, Thomas A. Gray and James Byron have conveyed all their right title and interest in and to the said claims to the Cascadia Mining and Development Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the state of Washington, and the said corporation desires to have the description so amended as to properly describe said claims;

Now therefore, in consideration of the premises, and the further sum of one dollar to me in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell, quit claim, release and convey unto the said Cascadia Mining and Development Company, and to its successors and assigns all my right, title, interest, claim and demand in and to the said mining claims aforementioned and particularly described as follows, to wit:

That certain mining claim known as the Minnie Lee, Dis. #1 Mining claim described as follows, to wit: Beginning at discovery and running 1500 feet in a easterly direction and 300 feet on each side of center of vein. The discovery is situated on the south slope on what is known as Goat Mountain about 1/4 mile North of Minnie Lee Camp and about 1 mile south west of Dead Man's Lake.

The mining location notice of the above claim is recorded in the Auditor's office of Lewis County, Washington, in book 5 Mining records, page 16. Also the Minnie Lee Dis. #2 Mining claim, described as follows: Beginning at discovery and running 1500 feet in a westerly direction and 300 feet on each side of center of vein. The discovery is situated on the South Slope on what is known as Goat Mountain about 1/4 mile North of Minnie Lee Camp and about 1 mile South west of Dead Man's Lake.

The location notice of the last above described mining claim is recorded in book 5 Mining records of the Auditor's office of said Lewis County, page 15. Also the Minnie Lee #3 Mining claim, described as follows,
