This Indenture, made this 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1902 by and between Henry Spangler and Lucie Spangler, his wife, parties of the first part and the Oregon and Washington Mining and Trust Co. an Oregon Corporation party of the second part.

Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of five hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt for which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold and conveyed and forever released and quitclaimed unto the said party of the second part and to its successors and assigns forever all the following described mining claims situated in the St. Helens Mining District in Skamania County, State of Washington and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:-

The Chloride No. 1 East quartz claim, beginning at the discovery stake directly under a steep cliff at the head of cinabar slide on the South slope of Coak Mountain and about one half mile Northwest from Black Falls on the North Fork of the Toutle or Green River, extending along the ledge in an Easterly direction 1500 feet with the respective center end lines and corners marked by stakes.
