Peter Olson wife to Monroe Vallett.

Know all Men by these Presents, That Peter Olson, and Sigrid Olson, his wife of the County of Skamania in the State of Washington, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to us in hand paid by Monroe Vallett of the County of Skamania, State of Washington the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said Monroe Vallett and to his heirs and assigns forever, all of that certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Skamania State of Washington, and particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point 31.47 chains East of the South West corner of the North half of the H. Shepard Donation Land Claim, said corner being situated 15.75 chains East and 20.97 chains North of the quarter section corner to sections 1 and 36, Township 2 and 3 North Range 7 East; thence $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains in a southwesterly direction along the bed of a small creek; thence east $12\frac{1}{2}$ chains until it connects with the Southernly line of Monroe Vallett's place (the same being the South line of 50 acres heretofore deeded to said Vallett by A. W. Lambert, said deed being recorded in book 2 of Deeds, page 483, thence along said Southernly line to place of beginning containing 2 acres more or less, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances
