

In Consideration of one thousand two hundred ninety and no/100 (\$1299.00) Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the State of Washington does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto S. Benson of Portland, Oregon, his heirs and assigns, the following described lands selected by the State of Washington for Public Buildings at state Capital under section 17 of the Enabling Act. to wit:

The south half of section twenty-five (25), the northwest quarter of section twenty-four (24), and the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section thirteen (13) all in township three (3) north, range five (5) east of the Willamette Meridian, containing 520 acres, more or less, according to the government survey thereof.

To have and to hold the said premises, with their appurtenances, unto the said S. Benson, his heirs and assigns forever.
