

hereby been granted the right to occupy, for purposes of right-of-way lands situate in the county of Skamania, and said State of Washington, more particularly described as follows:

A strip of land one hundred (100) feet in width extending over and across lots 1, 2 and 3 and the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of section sixteen (16), Township one (1) north, Range five (5) east of the Willamette Meridian, the same being fifty (50) feet on each side of the center line of the following described center line of the Columbia Valley Railroad across said section 16, to wit:-

Beginning at the point of intersection of said center line with the west boundary line of lot 4 in said section 16 thence in a south-westerly direction on a spiral following a 5' curve to the left 100, feet more or less, to Station number 3291-54.6 of said railroad survey; thence south $38^{\circ}32'$ west along a tangent to said spiral a distance of 3181.4 feet to station 3323-36; thence along a curve to the right of 716.8 feet radius a distance of 649 feet to station number 3329-85; thence north $89^{\circ}33'$ west along a tangent to said curve a distance of 125 feet to station number 3331-71.5; thence along a spiral (to the curve following) to the left of $7^{\circ}21'$ a distance of 210 feet to station 3333-81.5; thence along a curve to the left of 811.3 feet radius a distance of 168.2 feet to station number 3335-49.7; thence along a spiral (to said curve) to the left of $7^{\circ}21'$ a distance of 210 feet to station number 3337-59.7; thence south $63^{\circ}57'$ west along a tangent to said spiral a distance of 733.9 feet to the west line of said section 16 at about station number 3344-93.6

The above strip of land contains 12.71 acres, more or less.
