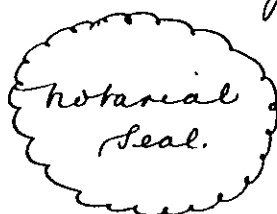

This Indenture, made the Twenty third day of August in the year of our Lord, one thousand, nine hundred and one between A. Hooper of Portland Ore. party of the first part, and Otto Roebber, of Portland, Ore party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and other valuable consideration to me in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns the following described Mining claim, known as the Golden Crown No. 1 situated in the St. Helens Mining District, Skamania County, Washington and recorded with the County Recorder of said County, at Stevenson Washington as is more fully described as follows: Beginning at the center of what is known as Devils Slide and where location Notice is posted and running 1500 (Fifteen Hundred) linear feet east, and 300 (three hundred) feet on each side of center of said vein or lode. The discovery is situated on the Devils Slide, on the north slope of the Kelack Mountain Range about 1/4 mile
