

and the grantors do hereby give and grant to the grantee a right of way across any or all of such lands for a flume or flumes or railroad or railroads to be used for the transportation of such timber and timber or timber products from other lands which it may be necessary or convenient to transfer across any of the lands herein described, and for the transportation of supplies used in carrying on the grantee's business. Such right of way to continue from a period of twenty years from the date hereof.
