

Chas. Schumard & wife to A. Hooper

This Indenture, Made the 10th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Nine hundred and two between Charles C. Schumard of Winlock, Lewis County, Mich. party of the first part. and A. Hooper the party of the second part, Witnesseth:

That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar Gold Coin of the United States of America, to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns: The following described Mining Claims to wit:— Beginning at Discovery stake where location notice is posted and running 1500 feet 302 south of west and 300 feet on each side of center of said vein. The Discovery is situated on Hannaford Lake on the South bank of same, about two miles north of Snow Lake and about two miles south of the Polar Star Mine on the Black Mountain Range and about five miles north of Mt. St. Helens and is known as Colinta Discovery No. 2. Also Beg. at the center of the Hannaford Outlet about 400 feet below on North of Lake opposite a tree where Location Notice is posted and running 1500 feet east and 300 feet on each side of center of said vein. The Discovery is about 400 feet north of Lake—about 2 miles north of Snow Lake and about 2 miles south of the Polar Star Mine and about 5 miles North of Mt. St. Helens on the North Slope of Black Mountain Range and known as Brown's Discovery No. 2. Also Beg. at the Discovery about 150 feet west of where location notice is posted on a prominent cliff and running 1500 feet East and 300 feet on each side of center of said vein, and is further described as follows: The Discovery is about 2000 feet north of Hannaford Lake on the headwaters of Grand Canyon Creek about 1 3/4 miles south of the Polar Star Mine and 2 1/4 miles North of Snow Lake and is on the North Slope of Black Mountain Range and about 5 miles of Mt. St. Helens and known as Cleopatra Discovery No. 2. Together with all the dips, upsurges and angles, and also all the metals, ores, gold and silver bearing quartz, rock and earth therein; and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, appurtenant and appurtenant, or therewith usually and enjoyed, and also all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, property, possession, claim and demand whatsoever as well in law as in equity, of the said party of the first part, of, in or to the said premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances. To Have and to Hold, all and singular the said premises, Together with the appurtenances and privileges thereto incident, unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever.
