And in case suit is instituted to collect this note or any portion thereof we promise to pay such additional sum as the Court may adjudge reasonable as attorney's fees to be taxed as a part of the costs of such suit for the use of plaintiffs attorney. It is specially agreed and consented that a deficiency judgment may be taken in a suit upon this note.
