Charles Meyers to The Underwood Mining Co.

This Indenture, made the 18th Day of July, A.D. 1903, between Charles Meyers, a widower, party of the first part, and the Underwood Mining Company, of Underwood's Landing, Skamania County, State of Washington, a Washington Corporation, duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Washington, party of the second part, Witnesseth: - That the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Nineteen Hundred Dollars stock in said corporation to them delivered, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, released, released and forever quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, release, release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the following described placer claim, situate in Negro Head Mining District, in Skamania County, State of Washington, to wit: -

commencing at the South east corner of John Bark's claim, running 640 feet South more or less to corner post, thence 40 rods west to corner post, thence 640 feet more or less north to corner post thence 40 rods east to place of beginning, together with all water and timber rights belonging to said claim, known as the "Bull" mining claim, located October 4th 1902 and recorded in Skamania County records
