

John Bark & wife to The Underwood Mining Co.

This Indenture, made the 18th day of July, A.D., 1903, between John Bark and Grace Bark, husband and wife, parties of the first part, and the Underwood Mining Company, of Underwood's Landing, Clallam County, State of Washington, a Washington Corporation, duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Washington, party of the second part, Witnesseth: - That the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Ninety Hundred Dollars stock in said corporation to them delivered, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quit claimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the following described place claim, situate in Negro Head Mining District, in Clallam County, State of Washington, to-wit: - commencing at the N.W. corner 20 rods East to stake thereof, 80 rods south to corner just there 40 rods west to corner just, thence 80 rods North to corner just, thence 20 rods east to place of beginning, together with all and singular water and timber rights belonging to said claim, to be known as "Lucky Jack" Mining Claim, located Oct. 14, 1902, recorded in Clallam County recorded in Book "B" of Mineral Location, page 571. Together with all and singular the dyes, spurs and angles, and also all the metals, ores, gold and silver bearing quartz, rocks and earth therein, and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, apparent and appurtenant, or therewith usually had and enjoyed, and also all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances, thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining; and the rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title and interest, property, processions, claim and demand whatsoever, as well in law and equity, of the said parties of the first part, of, in, or to the said premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances.

To have and to hold, all and singular, the said premises, together with the appurtenances and privileges thereto incident, unto the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns forever.
